GOSPEL REFLECTION: Theme: *Jesus' love transforms all people and all things!*

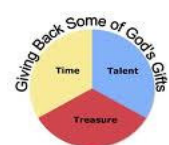
Jesus saw Zaccheus as he was – mistakes and all. What masks, if any, do you hide behind so others won't see who you really are? Who do you trust to see your true self?

Do we know Him well enough to receive in joy? Do we experience His love? Do we accept Him as our savior, or are we looking for something or someone else? It seems that only when we have some personal knowledge of Jesus, open our hearts to Him and accept Him as Christ, our savior, can we truly receive Him with joyful hearts.

FEAST OF ALL SAINTS: Monday, November 1st, is the feast of All Saints – a holy day. Mass times are noted above. Let us come together in prayer to celebrate those lives of faith, which have inspired us to live the Good News today.

SUPPORT VOCATIONS & CATHOLIC MILITARY CHAPLAINS NEXT WEEKEND: Currently, 285 Catholic military chaplains provide pastoral care to over 1.5 million Catholics on ships, in combat, on bases and in 153 VA hospitals. Next week's 2nd collection for the Archdiocese of the Military Services (AMS) will fund their Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program, which identifies vocations within the military and is now educating 30 men for the priesthood and subsequent military chaplaincy.
